Detailed instructions have been issued through the above circulars  
for regulating the reimbursement of Medical Expenses and prescription  
of medicines Circular referred to at 3rd cited embraces all important  
items like restricting the

- 1) Period of prescription for 10 days
- 2) Directing patient to Government of RTC clinics in cases of  
uncontrolled sickness
- 3) Medicines to be prescribed and supplied as per the Annexure to  
Circular No PD 97/75-76 dt 9 1 1975
- 4) Banning routine way of prescription of antibiotics
- 5) Indenting and Stocking of medicines at Depots and Units to be  
kept at the disposal of Authorised Medical Attendant with relevant  
records
- 6) Responsibility of the Controller of Stores of the Region to stock  
and supply of medicines to Depots on requisition
- 7) Records to be maintained at Depot and Unit level for  
reimbursements and
- 8) Referring of habitual reimbursement cases to Tarnaka Hospital

The Chief Medical Officer Tarnaka Hospital also has expressed vide his D O Letter No SC/198(1 )/81 dated 24 11 1981 that he is scrutinising all cases referred to him strictly in accordance with the instructions

As such all the Unit Officers are therefore advised to follow the instructions and to control and regulate the claims of reimbursement of Medical Expenses accordingly
