Sub: **BUS PASSES** – Consultancy by M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co. – Assessment of commercial value of trips performed by various sections of bus pass holders for estimating the loss sustained by the Corporation – Survey – Systems and procedures for issue of concessional bus passes – Recommendations by M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co – Guidelines issued - Reg.

As per the Orders of Government, M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co. has been entrusted to assess the commercial value of the trips performed by various sections of bus pass holders availing different types of concessions provided by Corporation, as directed by Government from time to time, for estimation of the loss sustained by APSRTC.

M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co. have submitted the final report in two volumes to Corporate Office, wherein they have made certain recommendations on the discrepancies noticed during the survey. The Government after going through the survey report is insisting for action taken report on the recommendations made by M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co.

Therefore, after considering the above facts and keeping in view that the Government is reimbursing the 100% cost of concessions from the year 2005-06 extended to different categories of commuters there is every need to avoid any irregularity in issuing concessional buss passes to different categories of commuters at Depot level and consolidation of data at Regional level. Hence, the following guidelines are issued for strict compliance, with immediate effect.

1) DISCRIPANCIES AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

b. M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co. has observed that majority of discrepancies related to bus pass applications not being properly completed.

The Depot Manager / Supervisor should instruct the concerned clerk who is dealing with issue of concessional bus passes to different categories that the concessional bus passes be issued to applicants only after ensuing that the applications are duly filled-in in all respects and should not entertain any incomplete application form.

c. M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co. has observed that most of the Depots are not maintaining bus pass issue registers for the different types of student passes issued, which is leading to lack of control on the passes issued.

At Depot level the Depot Manager and the in-charge Supervisor should see that for each category there should be a separate Bus Pass Issue Register and it should contain all the relevant information of the bus pass holder.

d. M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co. has observed that at most of the Depots, the bus pass applications relating to the current year are not being preserved due to various reasons like lack of space etc. This leads to lack of control over bus pass issued.

As the Government is reimbursing 100% cost of concession from 2005-06 onwards, Depot Manager / Supervisor should take care to preserve the applications relating to the current year, until all the passes issued during the current year lapses.

e. M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co. has observed that in places like Warangal, Vijayawada & Visakhapatnam, the student passes issued at one Depot are being renewed at other Depots in the City, even though there is no computerization or transfer of data between the Depots.

The Depots in Warangal, Vijayawada and Vishakapatnam should workout more compact procedures, which includes circulation of database of the pass holders, specimen signatures of the Head of the Institution between the Depots. Therefore there should be centralized data bank which enable all the Depots to renew the bus passes.

f. M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co. has observed that in many cases, the Depot is not insisting on a separate Bonafide from the students and they are issuing passes on the basis of the Certificate of the Head of the Educational Institution on the pass application, even though the application specifies that a separate Bonafide is to be taken.

The Depots should insist for separate Bonafide Certificate from the Head of the Institution for every student before the passes are issued in addition to the attestation on the bus pass application form. g. M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co. has observed that in some cases photocopies of bus pass applications are used by the applicants.

Depots should procure sufficient quantity of type numbered bus pass application forms from the Stores in order to avoid accepting the Xerox copies of the bus pass application forms from the bus pass holders.

h. M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co. has observed that there are cases where the student has taken a bus pass on the basis of a Bonafide from the Educational Institution, but is presently not in the rolls. The Depots were not in a position to explain whether such passes are currently operative or not, due to lack of control on the passes issued.

The Depots should insist the Educational Institutions to send the details about the students leaving their Institution at an earlier instance, for the Depot to take necessary action at their end. The Depot Manager / Supervisor should adopt a system of verifying student buss passes on a regular basis with the records of Institutions to avoid such discrepancies and its impact on subsidy claim.

i. AFF during visit to Educational institutions has found out that passes were obtained by forging the signatures of the authorized signatories of the Educational Institutions, thereby rendering loss to APSRTC.

The Depots should cross verify the details of the applicants from the respective Educational Institutions before issuing the passes. Wherever it is not practicable to verify before issuing the passes, the Depot should cross verify later at the earliest possible date, where upon loss can be minimized in cases where unfair practices have been applied.

2) CONSOLIDATION OF THE STATEMENTS AT VARIOUS LEVELS.

M/s.A.F.Ferguson & Co. has observed at various stages that the formats of the reports / statements prepared are not standard and they are varying between one Depot / Regional Office to another, which is leading to erroneous consolidations at the next level.

All the Regional Managers are therefore requested to evince utmost care in sending the consolidated statement of their respective Regions to Corporate Office correctly in the proforma annexed so as to maintain uniformity of the Statements at all levels. Any deviation from the proforma prescribed will be viewed seriously.

-: 4 :-

At Depot level the Depot manager is responsible for any irregularity and wrong claims made while sending the information to the Regional office and in turn to Corporate Office. Further the guidelines and instructions issued vide Circular 35/2003 Dated 15.05.2003 regarding action to be taken at Depot level and Regional level shall also holds good.
