Sir,

Sub: Apprenticeship Act, 1961 - Period of Training
Rebate Allowed - Rates of Stipends payable
etc. to the apprentices - Regarding.

Ref: Your lr.No. SO(ML)28/88-TRG dt. 18.3.88.

I am directed to enclose herewith a copy of the
DGET-6(1)87-A.P. dated: 25th November, 1988 showing the list
of designated trades, period of training rebate allowed
etc., and also a copy of Notification No. DGET-4(2)/86-AP
dt. 19.10.87 on rates of stipend payable to the Apprentices
with effect from 19.10.87 (GSR.363(E)).

As per rule § 7(1) of the Apprenticeship Act, 1961
the minimum rates of the stipend payable to the trade
Apprentices is as follows:

During 1st year of training Rs. 290/- per month.
During 2nd year of training Rs. 330/- per month.
During 3rd year of training Rs. 380/- per month.
During 4th year of training Rs. 440/- per month.

Provided that in the case of apprentices referred to
in clause (a) of Section 6 of the Act the period of training
already undergone by them in a school or other institution
recognised by the National Council shall be taken into account
for the purpose of determining the rate of stipend payable.
To explain this norm, the following example is given.
In the case of Mech. (Motor Vehicle) Fitter, Electrician,
the total period of training is 3 years. Out of which
2 years rebate i.e. the period of training undergone at
I.T.I., will be given to the relevant trade ex-III passed
out candidates. Thus the balance of training will be
one year. Which is treated as 3rd year and a stipend
@ Rs. 380/- per month should be paid.
